Dear Parents/Carers,

I am writing to raise the profile of 'Pupil Premium Funding' and 'Free School Meals' within our school community from EYFS through to Year Six. Whilst all children in EYFS and Key Stage One access free school meals, it is important that parents apply for pupil premium funding. If eligible, this funding means pupils are entitled to free schools meals from year 3-6, where they would otherwise have to pay.

On top of this, the school also receives additional pupil premium funding for pupils who access pupil premium funding. This is crucial in enabling us to support children at school appropriately, placing high importance on their social and emotional well-being in addition to their academic support.

Please take time to read the attached flyers and if you believe that you are eligible to apply for this funding, I urge you to do so. If you require any support with this, please do not hesitate to contact me via the school office. If you have a child who is in receipt of pupil premium funding, you will also need to apply separately for their younger siblings.

If you apply and qualify for Free School Meals, your child's school will receive additional funding called Pupil Premium, up to £1,320 a year.

Even though all children in Key Stage I receive Universal Infant Free School Meals, your child's school can only benefit from Pupil Premium funding if you apply, and are eligible, for Free School Meals. Don't delay the funding ... apply today!

Schools spend the pupil premium money on anything that can help your children do well at school, including trips, activities and extra support.

Applying online only takes a few minutes and, if eligible, your child will continue to receive Free School Meals until:

The end of Year 6 (if they are in primary school on

31 August 2025

The end of Year II (if they are in secondary school on 31 August 2025

This is even if your income rises above the threshold at any point during that time.

Eligibility

To get free school meals you need to be receiving one of the following:

- Universal Credit (up to £7,400 net earned income)
- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop working altogether or start to work less than 16 hours per week)
- Child Tax Credit but no element of Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190

If your child attends one of the following schools, you will need to apply direct to the school as they administer their own free school meal:

Thomas Clarkson Academy, City of Peterborough Academy, Gladstone Primary Academy, Newark Hill Academy, Stanground Academy, Thomas Deacon Academy, Welbourne Primary Academy.
